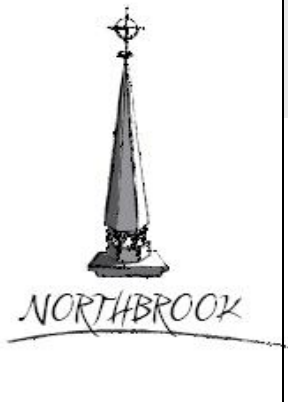

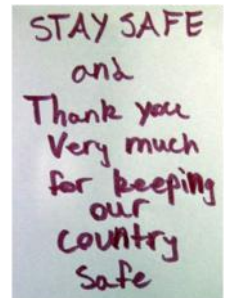

Our Lenten Journey Begins

As we enter into this season of Lent, we have the opportunity to ponder the great mystery of God's unconditional and boundless love and our response. Here is an excerpt from the [Companion to the Book of Common Worship](#) (Geneva Press, 2003, 109-110) that will help us understand this beginning time, Ash Wednesday.

*The Lenten journey from the ashes of death to resurrected life begins on the first day of Lent, Ash Wednesday, which signifies **a time to turn around, to change directions, to repent.** This first day of Lent reminds us that unless we are willing to die to our old selves, we cannot be raised to new life with Christ. The first step of this journey calls us to acknowledge and confront our mortality, individually and corporately.*

In many traditions, this is symbolized through the imposition of ashes — placing a cross on one's forehead. On Ash Wednesday, we begin our Lenten trek through the desert toward Easter. The ashes we wear on our Lenten journey symbolize the dust and broken debris of our lives as well as the reality that eventually each of us will die.

*Trusting in the "accomplished fact" of Christ's resurrection, however, we listen for the Word of God in the time-honored stories of the church's Lenten journey. We follow Jesus into the wilderness, resist temptation, fast, and proceed "on the way" to Jerusalem and the cross. Our Lenten journey is one of **metanoia ("turning around"), of changing directions from self-serving toward the self-giving way of the cross.***

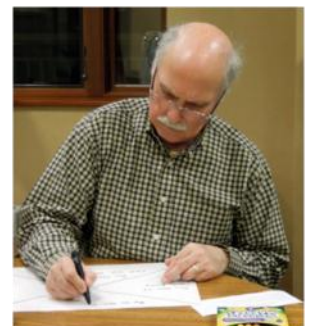

It has already been determined, based on our membership count, that in 2012 Northbrook will pay \$10,777 to the Presbytery of Detroit for Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly costs. This is just about the same cost as 2011. These very worthy, but bare bones groups, work to support our denomination in Beverly Hills and around the world.

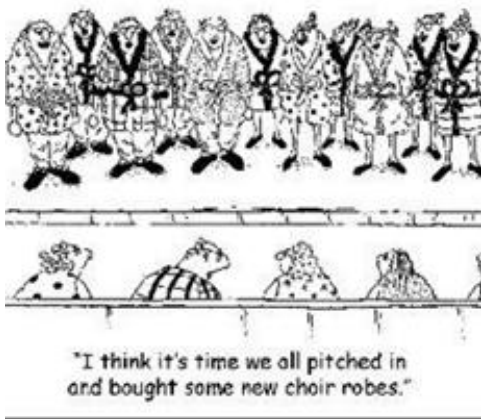

The per capita contribution is \$23.48 for every Northbrook member in your household and goes towards paying the \$10,777 that Northbrook pays Presbytery.

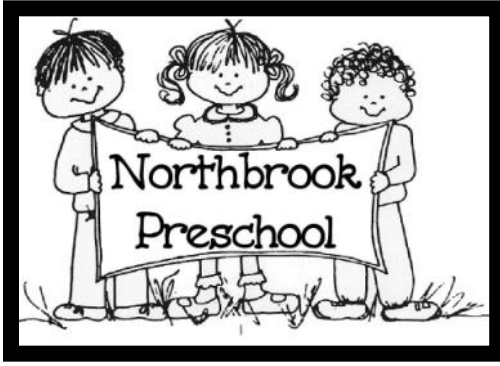

Men's Belts, especially in large sizes, are needed for the clothing closet at Fort Street. They can be placed in the clothing bins in our coat rack area in the main hall.

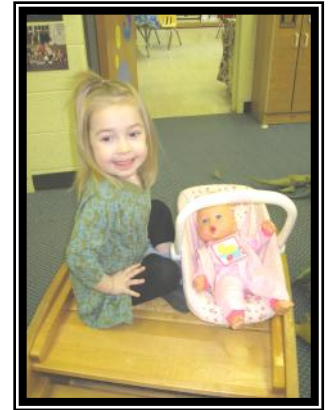

.....Last of Winter months...It's February. President's Day, Groundhog Day, Valentines Day, Ash Wednesday and an extra day, "leap day," are in this month. We celebrate Lincoln's and Washington's birthdays. I will chat about our least coin, the penny, which holds Lincoln's profile.

Do you stop and stoop to pick up a dropped penny? I do. Once, it used to buy me a big wad of bubble gum or a Mary Jane candy. I was rich.



Today, a found penny assures me "In God We Trust" and Lincoln's face. Polls tell us he is our favorite President. I can believe this.

Lincoln is our tallest President and had the biggest feet...size fourteen. Facts tell us he was a Christian but did not attend church. He read the Bible but did not pray at meals. He was somewhat a psychic who predicted his death when he saw two images of himself in the mirror, one in gray and one his normal self. He was killed six months later. Séances were held at the White House by his wife. Their two sons died very young, and they wanted to try to connect with them. It's unknown if contact was made. He had four sons but no heirs.

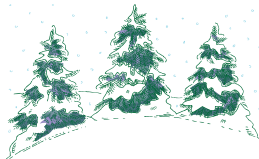
